Organize Club to Protect Fishing

Anglers of Absecon Island Will Safeguard Sport and Streams 2/23/23

Half a hundred enthusiastic hook and line fishermen who are anxious to safeguard the sport and to prevent stream pollution as well as to form casting teams to compete with those representing other resorts up and down the coast, and notably Asbury Park and Ocean City, last night organized the Anglers' Club of Absecon Island. It is open to any resident or visiting fisherman who is interested in the sport. It is the purpose of the club to select a site at the lower end of the island, some point outside of Atlantic City and build a pier for surf fishing and casting.

A preliminary test of candidates for the casting team will be made on the Atlantic City beach at the ocean end of Pacific avenue next Sunday afternoon. The meeting last night was held in the Council Chamber, Ventnor City Hall, that resort having been the first to construct a fishing pier for those who fish with the rod. The next meeting will be held on March 1, in the "Brown Room" of the Alamac Hotel.

With respect to the necessity for protecting streams emptying into the ocean it was pointed out that due to pollution of the waters fishing for sturgeon, shad and sheepshead has been eliminated within the past few years. The pound nets offshore, owned and operated by market fishermen, also have a disastrous effect upon the sport.

Officers elected were, President, Dr. R. Johnson Held; vice-president, Milton Latz; secretary, H. W. Shaner; treasurer, Frank Stewart; directors, Charles Stubbs, Ray Colwell, and Arthur Reilley. Chairmen of the committees were named as follows: publicity, H. W. Shaner; membership, Arthur Reilley; pier site, Charles Stubbs, and casting, Ray Colwell. The new club will affiliate with the National Anglers' Association.
