15 1-2 Pound Bass Caught In Margate

Any sportsman who thinks the fishing season is over in the resort has another thought coming. Frank Young, one of the original members of the Anglers' Club in Margate, and a prominent surfer, proved that the fish are still biting when he pulled in a 15 pound 8 ounce striped bass off the Anglers' Pier yesterday afternoon. The fish was 35 1/2 inches in length and 19 1/2 inches in girth. Young used a sand eel as bait.

According to H. Willard Shaner, noted authority on fishing, the catch was the largest made since the Margate pier was constructed back in 1923.

Young wasted little time in entering the fish in several tournaments in an attempt to win himself a prize.

PHILA. PARTY GETS HEAVY FISH CATCH

ATLANTIC CITY, Aug. 1—Henry Asam, Harry Gardner, Dr. Charles Hankinson, Ed Grunlock, Judge Edwin Lindell and Thomas B. Belle, of Philadelphia, while fishing from the Anglers' Pier, caught over 250 kings, 150 weakies and 35 perch.

Water temperatures have been uniformly warm. Large catches of kingfish and weakfish are being taken from the surf and piers, while flounders are good in the back bays.
