## Greco Keeps National Boys' Championship in Casting Tournament

Frank Buddy Greco, 13, of the Anglers' Club of Absecon Island, successfully defended his National Boys' Casting Championship Saturday afternoon at Ventnor. He averaged 267 feet in 3 casts to nose out James Katz, 15, of the Dover Club, Philadelphia, who averaged 266 feet. Katz was his only real opposition, the third boy Robert Johnson, of Atlantic City, averaging 229.

Greco looks forward to a few more years as the titleholder. He also won the longest cast event with a 300-foot cast.

In the men's casting tournament held Sunday at the same location in Ventnor, Frank Obesky, of the Trenton Rod and Gun Club won both the average and longest cast events. His distances were: Average of Three Casts, 445.11, Longest, 478.10. Harry Faske, of the same club, was a strong second with 431.00 in the average, and 468.7 in the distance event.

Willis Johnson, of the local Angler's Club, was fourth in the longest cast event with 441.3 and the first local angler to finish which makes him Absecon Island Champion and brought to him the President's gold medal.

Peter Glick, of the local Club, took first place in the accuracy column, the only win for Margate.

Each night after the tournament luncheon was served the entries and prizes awarded. H. Willard Shaner was chairman in charge of both tournaments.

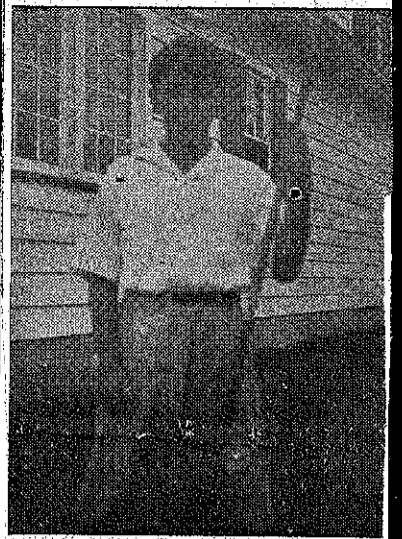
## Storm Doesn't Dampen Spirit of Pier Guests
