Peter Glick, Re-Elected Pres. of Anglers Club

Biggest Catch of Season Recorded

At the eleventh annual meeting of the Anglers Club of Absecon Island, held on Saturday night, over 50 members were in attendance. Peter Glick, Esq., of Pittsburgh, was re-elected president; Joseph Bush, vice-president; H. W. Shaner, secretary, and Frank Jacobs, treasurer.

I. J. Wolff, a member of the Anglers, while fishing off Little Beach last Saturday, caught a 53-pound cow-ray. William Byers, the past week caught two weakfish, weighing 7 pounds and 3 1/2 pounds. Monday, August 14th, was the day of the banner catch of the season. Over 900 fish were taken from the surf at the Club's Pier.

The seven sons of seven fathers have issued a defy for a father and son casting tournament to be held this next weekend. And the funny part of it is the seven fathers are afraid of being beaten.

Jack Augenblick caught a 3 1/4 lb. skate on six thread line. He is leading for the cup for heaviest fish caught on 6 thread.

The total catch for the week by the anglers from the pier head was 2477.

Boys' Casting Tournament

The Association of Surf Angling Clubs, a national body comprised of all the leading Surf Fishing Clubs throughout the East, will conduct a national Boys' Casting Tournament, assisted by the Anglers' Club of Absecon Island at Margate, Saturday, August 26.

There will be two events, average of three casts and the longest of three casts. The winner of the average event will be awarded a solid gold medal, which carries with it the National Boys' Casting Championship. Silver medal for second place, and a bronze medal for third place, and about fifty other prizes of fishing tackle and sporting goods, will be awarded.

All contestants must be under 16 years of age; no entrance fee is necessary and participants may come from all parts of the East.

Prizes will be awarded at the Pier House Saturday evening, after the Tournament.

The Tournament will be under the direction of H. W. Shaner, Secretary-Treasurer of the Association, who has successfully conducted these Tournaments throughout the East.

The 1933 Championship was won by Robert Fox of Cynwyd, Pa., who is now over the age limit.

Among the outstanding contenders for the championship medal is Howard Todt, age 14, of Audubon, N. J., and who is a junior member of the Dover Club of Philadelphia. Young Todt is casting close to the 400 foot mark and appears to be the favorite.

Greco Annex Casting Crown

Twelve-year-old Frank "Bud" Greco, Philadelphia Summer tager in Margate, was crowned National Boys' Surf Casting champion over a field of 80 entrants yesterday afternoon in the second tournament sponsored by the association of Surf Angling Clubs in conjunction with the Angler's Club of Absecon Island, at Essex Amherst avenues.

The youth was presented with gold association medal emblem of his victory, and the two runners up, William Balardy, 15, of Belmar Fishing Club, and George Enders, 13, of 105 S. Essex av., awarded silver and bronze medals respectively, for second and third place, by Mayor Walter S. Johnson at the Angler's clubhouse, 105 S. Essex avenue and the Boardwalk, last night.

Yesterday was the first time Greco, who had an average of 200 feet, three inches in three successive casts, has ever won a competition of this kind. The lad, a student in the sixth grade at the E. Allen Poe School, in Philadelphia, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Felix Greco, whose cottage is 103 S. Essex mont av.

Barady, runner up to Greco, aged 231 feet 10 inches in his three casts, while Enders, grandson of Councilman Clymer, of Ventnor, an average of 210 feet seven inches. George "Bud" Gravenstein Jr., of Philadelphia, won fourth place with a score of 206 feet four inches. Charles "Honey" Salesky, 14, of S. Princeton av., fifth place, an average of 206 feet three inches. Robert Blaetz, sixth place, averaged 204 feet four inches.

An interesting point about Salesky is that the youth handled a reel and reel for the first time in his life Friday afternoon. His excellent casting which won him fifth place in the tournament for boys under 16 years of age, puts him in the race for next year's title if he continues his winning streak.

In the distance event for which a special prize was awarded for the longest of three casts, Robert Blaetz, 15-year-old Olney High School student, of Philadelphia and 100 Howard av., Ventnor, and junior member of the Ventnor Club, made a cast of 300 feet six inches. His line broke earlier in the tournament and disqualified him in the average event.

Young Greco was "double" champion of the day and placed second in the distance event with a well poled cast of 275 feet 11 inches. Enders who won third in the average event placed the same in the distance casts with 263 feet four inches, while Peter Glick Jr., 11, son of President of the Angler's Club, made a cast of 256 feet ten inches. Blaetz placed fifth in the distance cast with 241 feet 11 inches.

The winning youth comes by skill through the tutelage of H. Willard Shaner, who was in charge yesterday's tournament. He is a member of the junior casting team at the Angler's, the "Sea Hawks," which will challenge the senior "Sea Hawks" team this afternoon. The lad's brother, Toby, former Philadelphia medal winner.

Last night more than 50 youths who placed in the tournament received prizes of sporting goods for their efforts, were entertained with a magic show, and were served refreshments at the Angler's clubhouse.
