## Anglers Climax Season With Party and Dance

Sons Beat Fathers in Casting Bout

Over 10,000 Fish Caught This Season, an All Time Record

Saturday night the Anglers Club will hold their farewell dance at the Club House, Essex Ave. and the Boardwalk. This will be their last get-together social this season. The public are cordially invited to join to make this affair the biggest and best this season. The Club's officials have spared no efforts to make this a most entertaining affair. Admission will be one dollar, which includes refreshments and a buffet lunch.

On Sunday afternoon, August 27, the Father and Son Casting Tournament was held at Essex and Amherst Aves. by the Anglers Club of Absecon Island. Eight fathers with their 8 sons were entered in the contest, and the sons won by 505 feet 5 inches.

The Sea Hawks, as the daddies were called, made a total of 6,352.4 feet, while their sons, going under the name of the Sand Fleas, got together 6,857.9 feet, or 505.5 feet more than their fathers. The teams average were: Sand Fleas, 171.5; Sea Hawks, 158.9.

A silver cup was the prize contested for, which was given the winners on last Monday night at the Anglers Club House.

The contestants—fathers and sons—were: Asam, Berger, Ford, Gravenstein, Heinekamp, Greco, Stern and Glick.

### Boy's Casting Tournament

Frank "Buddy" Greco, 12-year-old Philadelphia Summer resident of Margate, gained the championship in the National Boys' Surf Casting Tournament, in the second annual tournament, sponsored by the Association of Surf Angling Clubs, in conjunction with the Anglers Club of Absecon Island.

The contest was held at Essex and Amherst Aves. last Saturday.

Young Greco had an average of 253 feet, 3 inches in three successive casts. Barady, of Belmar, was runner-up with 231 feet, 10 inches, while Enders, of Ventnor, had an average of 210 feet, 7 inches, and won third place.

In the distance event, "Buddy" Greco cast a distance of 275 feet, 11 inches, but was out-distanced by Robert Berger who made a cast of 300 feet, 6 inches, while Enders was third with 263 feet, 4 inches.

The championship medals were presented by Mayor Walter S. Jeffries, at the Anglers Club House, Essex Ave. and the Boardwalk on Saturday evening.

### Fish Still Plentiful

The northeaster of last week seemed to have no effect on fishing, as there are plenty of croakers, weaks and perch caught daily off the Anglers' Pier Head. Saturday a total of 155 fish were caught.

### LOCAL CLUB TAKES 3RD PLACE
