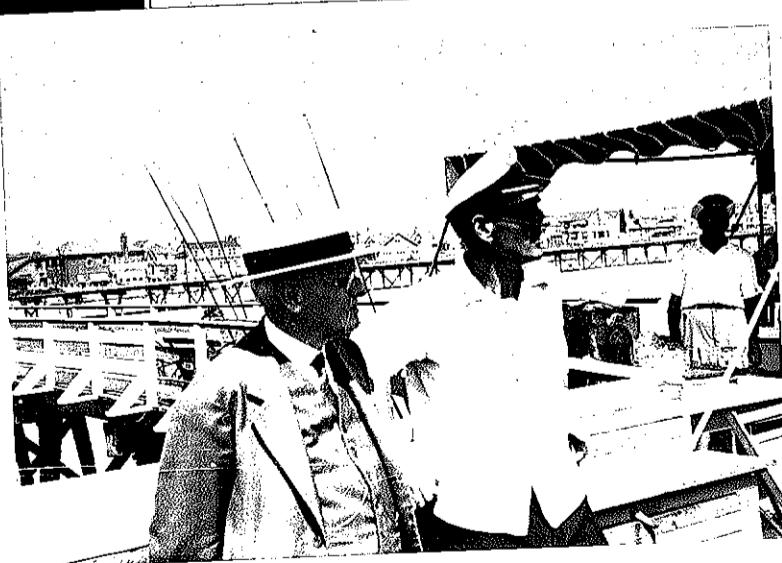

### WEAKFISH SCHOOLING

The northeast storm seems to have had little effect on local ocean fishing, good catches being taken all week from the Anglers' Pier as well as on boats that ventured out.

Many catches of large weakfish have been reported by boats fishing off the Bell Buoy. During the week at the Anglers' Pier, several weeks over three pounds have been landed besides a number of large croakers.

Two flounders, about 2½ pounds each were landed yesterday from the pierhead. Willis Johnson caught a 10½ pound rockfish while surf fishing in Longport.
