Anglers to Hold Their Fourth Season Dance at Pier on Aug. 12th

Making Extensive Repairs as Storm Protection

Last Saturday night the Anglers Club of Absecon Island staged their third successful dance at the club house, Essex Avenue and the Boardwalk. Although the function was not so well attended as the previous one, it was agreed by all present that they had as fine an evening's entertainment as at any of the past affairs.

August 12th will mark the fourth dance of the season which is being given to help entertain visiting fishermen, who will participate in the Ocean City Casting Club contest to be held on this date, and their families.

A contract for \$390 has been awarded to Captain Albert C. Westcoat of Atlantic City to renew piling which, when complete, will secure the Pier against winter storms. This completes the last permanent improvement planned for this year, about \$2,000 worth having been finished to date including carpenter work, painting and a total rewiring of the electrical system.
