Having won the first leg of the home-and-home contest last Sunday by a score of 60-5, the Anglers Club rolled up a total of 350 points against 257 points for the Ventnor Club.

The trophy, held by the Anglers, was presented as a mere formality to Joseph Bush, president of the Anglers Club, by Samuel Turvey, president of the Ventnor Club.

Frank Jacobs, treasurer of the Angler's Club, was awarded the Max Herman Trophy for capturing first place in two classes.

He had the largest catch, accounting for eight fish, and pulled in the largest finny specimen, a three and a half pound weakie.

Second laurels for most fish caught went to Willis Johnson who had a haul of seven.

Norris Trucksess, of the Anglers Club, received a prize for bringing in the first weakfish of the contest.
