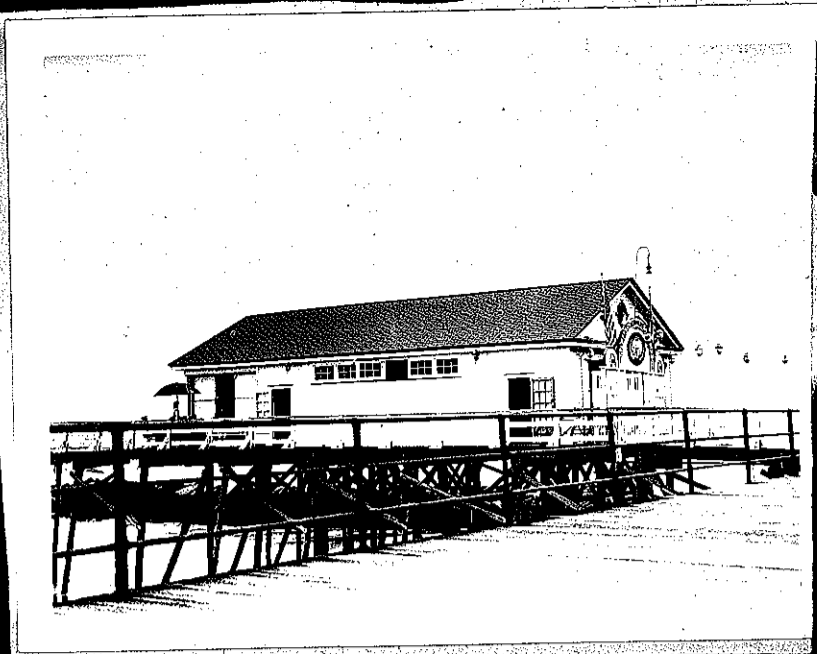


Anglers' Fishing News

During the past week fishing from the Anglers Pier went from very good to very poor, although 368 fish were caught by ardent fishermen. Friday was one of the best days this season, with a total catch for the day of 186, 15 men fishing. Spots, which were not caught from the pier in about 5 or 6 years, were brought in, raising the spirits of the Isaac Waltons. Catch for the day included 47 kings; 46 weakies; 27 spots and 66 perch.

With a drop in the water temperature, only 26 were caught on Sunday. Monday and Tuesday's catches were comparatively low, with 40 and 21 caught, respectively.

Wednesday's catch increased with the raise in water temperature, 85 being landed and, according to the piermaster, should the wind continue northeast, an excellent weekend of fishing should be in store for followers of the art of piscatory.

Anglers' Club Opens; First Kingfish Caught

BAIT AND TACKLE AVAILABLE

William Foeman, piermaster of the Anglers' Club at Essex Ave. and the Beach, landed the first kingfish from the pierhead, Wednesday. This is the earliest a kingfish was ever landed from the pier, beating last year's date by one day. The fish weighed 1 1/2 pounds.

Joe Roberts, who caught the first fish last year, caught the second this year, Thursday morning. It weighed 1 1/4 pounds. The remarkable incident is that Joe landed his first fish both years on the same date, May 9. Bloodworms were used as bait by both anglers.

May 1st, was opening date of the club which is well stocked with bait and fishing tackle.
