Local Boy Wins Casting Title For Third Time

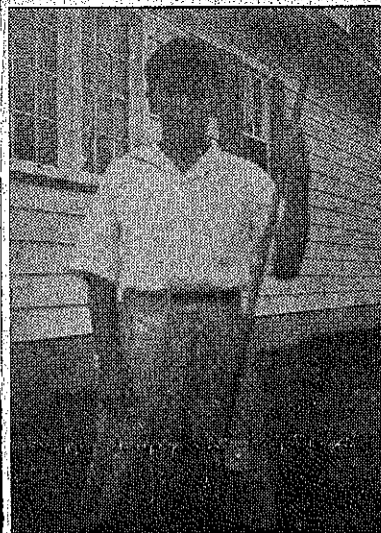
Frank "Buddy" Greco, representing the Margate Sand Fleas, captured the Boys' National Championship for the third consecutive time Saturday afternoon, in the sixth annual Association of Surf Anglers Club's tournament, staged by the Ventnor Fishing Club.

Greco, who is 14 years of age, won the average cast event with an average of 324 feet, 1 inch. Peter Glick, Jr., also of Margate, was second with 297.4, and Robert Johnson, third, with 238.11.

In the longest cast event, Bud Ford was first with 336 feet, 8 inches; Johnson second with 312.1, and Greco third with 312 feet.

The Sand Fleas won the team honors, with Ventnor taking second place.
