FISHING PIER FACILITIES OPEN TO VISITORS

Sunday will see the organization of the Affiliated Sportsman's Clubs of New Jersey finally a reality. Up to the present, each organization worked out its own problems in its own locality, often in some cases with little result, due to the small number of members. One of the prime reasons for organizing the Affiliated Sportsman's Clubs, according to Bud Master, noted game hunter and member of the Anglers' Club, is to promote outdoor sports in New Jersey, both by protection and increasing the facilities.

Saturday and Sunday the Anglers' Pier will be open to the sportsmen all day. Many of those expected have never visited Margate before, and it is hoped that a favorable impression will be made on these visitors. Sunday at 11 a. m. a meeting will be held in the Rose Room of the Hotel Traymore, Atlantic City. After the meeting,

a special sportsman dinner will be available for \$1.25.

Pier Fishing Good

Fishing at the Anglers' Pier is still good, many kings and weaks being taken during the past week. Quite a few of the most ardent anglers have left for their permanent homes, leaving the pier to residents and weekend commuters.

Joseph Roberts, president of the Club, has just returned from a ten-day fishing trip through the South and reports fishing conditions below Virginia very poor, due to the heavy rains which flooded the rivers and washed mud to sea. In some cases the sea water is muddy a distance of seven and eight miles from shore, practically ruining pound fishing. Roberts caught a good number of small channel bass (rockfish) off Tolley Beach, N. C., averaging 5 to 8 lbs.
