Alter Anglers' Club; Catches Increase As the Temperature Rises

Extensive alterations have been made at the Anglers' Club House, Essex Avenue and the Boardwalk, and an invitation has been extended to the ladies to use the main lounge. Cream and green venetian blinds have been placed on the windows, fiber rugs of a like color combination have been laid on newly scraped floors, and attractive modern furniture has been tastefully arranged.

Hot as well as cold water showers are now available, and alterations have been made in the locker room as well as in the store the club maintains.

Despite the attractive interior of the club house, fishermen find the most thrill on the pier, with a rod and reel in hand. Their catches during the past week started rather small on Sunday, with thirteen fish caught by twenty-four fishermen, but with the increase in temperature, over 150 fish, mostly kings, were taken by 13 Izaak Walton's on Wednesday. Total fish caught from the pier from Sunday to Wednesday, inclusive, amounted to 226, with a 3 1/2 lb. weakfish landed, the largest this season.
