The patience of the fishermen along the coast has not been rewarded so far this season. The storms and cold temperature of the water have been blamed for the small amount of fish caught.

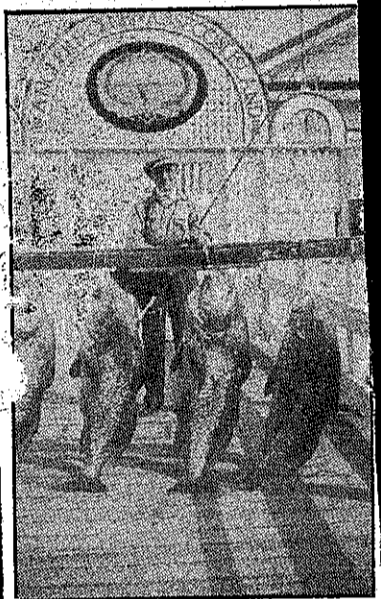
Every week sees more members of the Angler's Club, loaded down with fishing tackle, coming down and trying their luck with the finny tribe.

Simons, of Philadelphia, landed twelve kingfish, two weakfish, one flounder; Dr. C. B. Holbrook, of Ventnor, caught five kingfish, three weakfish; Dr. Charles Halpern, of Philadelphia, pulled in seven kingfish, four weakfish, one spot; Joseph Roberts, of Margate, reported a catch of seven kingfish, one weakfish, three spots, three perch; Jack Augenblick, of Philadelphia, reported a catch of five kingfish, two weakfish; S. W. Ford, of Margate, reported a catch of ten weakfish, five kingfish, two perch; A. J. Trenner, of Philadelphia, reported a catch of one kingfish, one spot; Thomas J. Stevenson, of Margate, landed one kingfish, one perch; Jules Cowan reported a catch of four kingfish, two flounder; Judge Lindell, of Philadelphia, had a catch of one kingfish; K. L. ### SMALL BOAT CURB LIFTED

Navy Now Permits All Licensed Craft to Fish in Ocean Toms River, N. J., July 22 (AP) Ocean County Freeholder A. Paul King said today he had been informed by Representative James C. Auchincloss (R-NJ) that Secretary of the Navy James V. Forrestal had rescinded the order prohibiting party fishing boats of less than 38 feet from operating off the Atlantic Coast.

King said the order, effective immediately, permitted all of the smaller boats which had been licensed before Pearl Harbor to resume food fishing and the carrying of fishing parties.
